MODULE 4 Part 1 - AI Transcript

The Constellation of Capricorn

Welcome to Module 4, Part One, where we will be discussing the constellation of Capricorn. Capricorn is the next constellation on the astrological wheel after Sagittarius. If you look at the wheel, we will be moving counterclockwise along it to note and track the constellations. This counterclockwise motion is the way that the Sun, Moon, and planets move along the astrological wheel.

Now, as we noted in the North Node lecture, the North Node is an aspect of the sky that moves *clockwise* along the astrological wheel. For the purpose of our lectures, we're going to go from Sagittarius over to Capricorn.

Capricorn is the constellation that holds the codes of **divine design**. Capricorn is essentially the CEO of the astrological wheel and of the constellations. This concept of the "cosmic CEO" comes directly from my teacher, Krista, over at Chalice Grove and Golden Age Leadership Astrology. When I first received that archetypal pattern of Capricorn, it made a lot of sense to me.

The CEO is the energy of understanding how all of the parts go together to make the greater whole—and Capricorn holds that. If Capricorn is the code of divine design (a phrase that I have personally channeled through), then it means it must comprehend how all of the parts fit together. The way a CEO understands how every aspect of a business moves to create flow, the energy of Capricorn understands how all parts come together to make the greater whole.

This is where Capricorn leans into its true truth as the first **Earth element** along the astrological wheel if we are starting at Sagittarius. From the fires of Sagittarius, we move into the earth energy of Capricorn.

If we continue with the analogy of the soul choosing to come into incarnation through Sagittarius, then Capricorn represents the energy of how a soul learns about the dimension it is entering. If a soul chooses to incarnate on Earth, the energy of Capricorn is where it learns everything about the dimension of Earth—all of the ins and outs, all of the design elements.

This notion of divine design brings into relationship the element of Earth and the aspect of the soul's journey where it chooses incarnation and learns about that incarnation. Capricorn is therefore an essential constellation. It is in **opposition to Cancer**, which holds the codes of divine flow. We'll learn more about Cancer in Part Two of Module 4.

For now, it's important to understand that Capricorn and Cancer are oppositional energies.

Let's now drop in the **midpoint dates of Capricorn**, which are **January 21 through February 15**. Again, this is a significant shift from traditional astrology, which would read most of those dates as Aquarius. Capricorn, however, holds these dates based on the midpoint system.

Capricorn and Aquarius form an interesting pair astronomically. Between Sagittarius and Capricorn, there's a small gap. But between Capricorn and Aquarius, the constellations actually overlap. Why do we consider the majority of those dates to be under Capricorn's energetics? Because for midpoint dating, we take the central line between the last star of one constellation and the first star of the next.

While the Sun is tracking through Capricorn, we read it as the energy of Capricorn. But during much of that transit, there is an overlapping energetic arm of Aquarius. Astronomically, this overlap exists because of how the constellations appear from our earthly vantage point. Energetically, it exists because the divine design energy of Capricorn leads directly into the evolutionary energy of Aquarius. The two work together.

Sagittarius holds the independent code of truth-seeking—the initiation of incarnation. There's a gap between Sagittarius and Capricorn, so once the soul completes the full energetic arc of Sagittarius, it intentionally steps into Capricorn saying, *I am ready to learn the ins and outs of the dimension I am entering. I am ready to learn the divine design of incarnation.*

As that process begins, it quickly moves into the evolutionary overlap with Aquarius. When we reach the lecture on Aquarius, we'll discuss that evolutionary energy further. But before we can lean into evolution, we must first learn structure, mapping, and multidimensional properties.

Capricorn is a **learning space about divine design**—the Earth element teaching us how everything fits together. It is beautifully balanced by its oppositional relationship with Cancer, the energy of divine flow.

A third major component of Capricorn is that it also holds the **divine masculine**. The divine masculine represents the structure that holds the energetic flow of creation. If Cancer is divine flow, then Capricorn is divine design—the structure, the container.

I like to use the analogy of the **riverbank and the river**. Without the riverbank, the river cannot flow. With the riverbank, the river flows—even through its rapids and still waters. The riverbank is the container for the river, just as Capricorn is the container for the divine flow represented by Cancer.

Through the patterns and codes of Capricorn, we learn that the divine masculine (Capricorn) is essential to support the divine feminine (Cancer), and the divine feminine inspires the divine masculine.

So, the divine design—the structure of our multidimensional reality—is held in the codes of Capricorn. When reading this in a chart, people with **placements in Capricorn** are often deeply interested in the *how* of things—how systems, relationships, and environments fit together. They are drawn to the structure, the interconnection, and the functional beauty of wholeness.

Capricorn is led in **Cosmic Design by the planet Neptune**, which we will explore in Part Three of Module 4. Neptune is a multidimensional planet, so the structure of Capricorn is equally multidimensional. Someone with Capricorn placements might therefore be interested not only in the systems of earthly life but also in how the parts of multidimensional reality weave together.

In summary:

Capricorn is the energy of **Divine Design** and **Divine Masculine**—how all of the parts come together to form the greater whole. As taught in Golden Age Leadership Astrology, it is the CEO of the astrological wheel. It carries the Earth element, is situated between Sagittarius and Aquarius (with strong overlap into Aquarius), and stands in opposition to Cancer. It forms part of the **Second Chord of Consciousness**, the relationship between Divine Design (masculine) and Divine Flow (feminine).
