MODULE 2 Part 3 - Transcript (verbatim):

Welcome to Module 2, Part Three, where we are discussing the North Node.

As we discussed in Part Two, the North Node, Midheaven, and Rising all work together. The Rising sign—the Ascendant—is the map. The North Node is the compass, or the True North. And the Midheaven is the destination.

Effectively, together, they create the keys to the chart. They create the very specific aspects of your soul code that will continue to keep you on the path of purpose for this incarnation.

So in this Part Three of Module 2, we'll discuss the North Node and what it is and what it means.

The Celestial Intersection

While the Midheaven was the intersection point of the meridian line and the ecliptic, the North Node is the intersection point of the ecliptic and the lunar path.

This is a really special place because it holds a very strong energetic portal—not just for the individual, but for the collective as well.

So while the Midheaven shifts with the time of day, the North Node is more stationary. This is why the North Node reads as the compass in this metaphor—the Rising sign being the map, the Midheaven being the destination, and the North Node being the compass which continues to guide you where you are intended to go.

The North Node, again, is the intersection point of the lunar path and the path of the ecliptic. It creates an energetic portal in the sky.

The Individual North Node

The North Node impacts the individual because it is the code that helps us remember how the soul can get back into alignment.

It is a realignment energy. It is a bringing-back-to-center energy. It is that True North.

So, if you are lost in the woods and you have a compass, you use the compass based on True North to find which direction you are going. It is a realignment.



This alignment energy serves great purpose because there are many times in life when we feel lost, out of alignment, off of our path. We might be having trouble remembering how to work toward our life purpose—or even what that purpose is.

In those moments, we can use the energy of our North Node to realign us, to bring us back to center, to quite literally bring us into a space where we can find where we are on the path of life.

This North Node placement gives us the tools we need to find our realignment energy.

When you read a North Node placement individually, you are reading it to identify the practices that are essential to bring someone back into alignment when they feel lost, when they feel out of whack, when they feel like they are not walking the path their soul chose to walk.

It's a beautiful placement to bring in very pragmatic practices—to bring people back into a space where they feel connected, aligned with their central channel of energy, and guided by their True North.

The Nodal Axis: North Node and South Node

When we look at the North Node, we're inherently also looking at the South Node—they create a nodal axis.

Your North Node is always in opposition to your South Node because it is quite literally a line to the opposite side of the chart.

The South Node holds a really important energy because it identifies the information that might still be living in the shadows. It might be something that's coming online to help us be in our life's purpose—or something our soul has carried over from lifetime to lifetime that we need to transmute in this one.

Other deep soul placements like Pluto and Chiron hold different purposes in the past-life soul information, but the South Node gives us insight into what we might be working on in a deeper, more shadowy way.

These are the parts of ourselves that might not feel in alignment—but if we get them into alignment, we return to harmony with our North Node and our True North.

The South Node may indicate personality traits or past-life ways of being that we are here to transmute. Those old patterns might be the very thing that kick us out of alignment.

So, we can look at them and utilize the oppositional relationship of the North Node to bring us back into alignment.

As we learn the various characteristics of the constellations, we'll start to learn pragmatic practices based on each one.

But for now, what you need to know is that:

- The **North Node** shows how to bring yourself back on track—how to use your inner compass to find your way back to real alignment.
- The **South Node** reveals what might be misaligning you.

This is the power of the nodal relationship: insight into both misalignment and realignment.

The Collective North Node

The North Node as a collective placement is quite different.

When reading collective charts, the North Node shows what we're moving through as a planet—what we're embarking on in our collective life's journey, and what we need to realign as humanity.

I like using the collective North Node placement in daily charts to give insight into what's going on collectively for humanity.

Why are certain things happening?

Where do we see potential for evolution of human consciousness?

I never read the North Node exclusively for the collective—I always include the South Node's oppositional placement. It gives insight into the current movements of energy on the planet.

It shows how humanity is realigning, what ways of being are out of alignment, and how we can move with the North Node to come back into alignment.

We never use the cosmos as an excuse—but we can use them to gain insight into how things are evolving and playing out on Earth.

So, when we look at the collective North Node, we might ask:

- Where is the collective North Node right now?
- What lessons are we learning as humanity?
- What tides are coming forward to guide us back into collective alignment?

The North Node functions as a potent placement for both the individual and the collective. It always relates to the South Node, forming a dynamic nodal axis of polarity and purpose.

Movement and the Cosmic Spiral

One final thing about the North Node that I really like to share—it moves in the *opposite* direction of the planets, the Moon, and the Sun as we track them along the astrological wheel.

If you project today's date six months or a year from now, you'll see that the North Node moves clockwise, while the planets, Sun, and Moon move counterclockwise.

The North Node moves with the clockwise direction of the constellations.

This reveals the *spiral essence* of the astrological wheel—one of the most beautiful parts of True Sky Astrology and Cosmic Design.

When we notice the true movements and sizes of the constellations, we see that everything is constantly moving, orbiting, spiraling through the void of space.

Our Sun is part of a great spiral around the black hole of the Milky Way Galaxy, and the galaxies themselves spiral around others. It's spiral upon spiral upon spiral.

For those aware of fractal patterns, we find the spiral everywhere—within ourselves, surrounding us, and in the cosmos.

This first hint of the spiral, visible in the motion of the North Node, is a beautiful access point to reading the *living codes* of the sky.

When we read the spiral, the cosmos become alive.

Reflection Practice

Next, we will discuss the importance of the Rising Sign and how it relates to the Midheaven and the North Node.

But for now, go back into your chart and:

- 1. Find your **North Node** placement.
- 2. Find your **South Node** placement.
- 3. Intuitively reflect:
 - O What practices help you realign when you feel lost?
 - What recurring patterns pull you out of alignment?

Be honest in your reflection. These are the codes beginning to reveal themselves to you.

In order to be open to the codes, you must be open to receive.

In order to truly tune into your intuition and open your channel, you must be open to receive.

These initial reflections—without needing all the details—are essential to revealing the soul codes of your birth chart and chosen placements.

So, open your chart. Look at your North Node. Sense what you begin to feel from the placement of your North and South Nodes.
